

Sandhills Area Development Assn. Lays Final Plans For Organization

A major step in the organization of the four-county Sandhills Area Development association was taken at a luncheon meeting here Friday of the planning committee, composed of representatives from Lee, Moore, Richmond and Montgomery counties.

Paul C. Butler of Southern Pines, chairman, presided over the meeting, at the Howard Johnson's Restaurant at which the new association was named and the next step outlined.

His will be the selection of six-member boards of directors for each county, who will combine to form the associational board of directors. The board will meet as soon as selected, adopt a constitution and by-laws and a kickoff dinner will be held at some place they designate within the area. All interested persons, at least 50 from each county, are expected to attend and hear the associational plan outlined and its objectives set.

In each county's organization there will be also four representatives for each of the project divisions by which the association will accomplish its purpose of better income, better living standards and improved opportunities for youth. These divisions—industrial development, agricultural development, community and travel and recreation—will also be represented by chairmen and vice-chairmen in the associational set-up.

J. W. Crawford, program planning specialist with the State College Extension Service, assisted in the planning with details of the way other such associations throughout the State have got started on their way, in the county-cooperative effort which in some cases has worked out with much success.

John E. Johnson of the staff of the State Department and Conservation and Development offered his department's help, also, he told the group, "if you have ideas or want to start projects in tourism or industry, or agriculture-industry combinations, and don't know whom to contact for

help, let us know and we'll find the right person or persons for you." He congratulated the group on their big step forward in which he saw a potential of great progress.

One county, Montgomery, had already picked its six directors—J. C. Liles, Hamlet; Joe Comer, Ellerbe; Ben Lewis, Rockingham; Mrs. A. H. McCall, Ellerbe, Rt. 1; N. P. Nicholson, Mt. Gilead, Rt. 3 and J. R. Faison, farm agent, Rockingham.

Estimates Given On Peach Crop For Southern States

The Agriculture Department's crop reporting board has estimated that 1959 peach production in nine leading Southern states will total more than 14 million bushels.

The figure is about one-tenth lower than the crop of 15,748,000 bushels last year, but still the second largest crop for the area in more than 10 years.

As of May 1, the estimate for North Carolina was 1,200,000 bushels. For other states, the breakdown was this: South Carolina, 5,000,000 bushels; Georgia, 3,400,000 bushels; Alabama, 1,040,000 bushels; Mississippi, 420,000 bushels; Arkansas, 1,850,000 bushels; Louisiana, 12,000 bushels; Oklahoma, 170,000 bushels; and Texas, 850,000 bushels.

Some growers in Moore County have been optimistic about the crop this year, predicting it will be one of the best in history. Weather conditions have hurt some but not extensively.

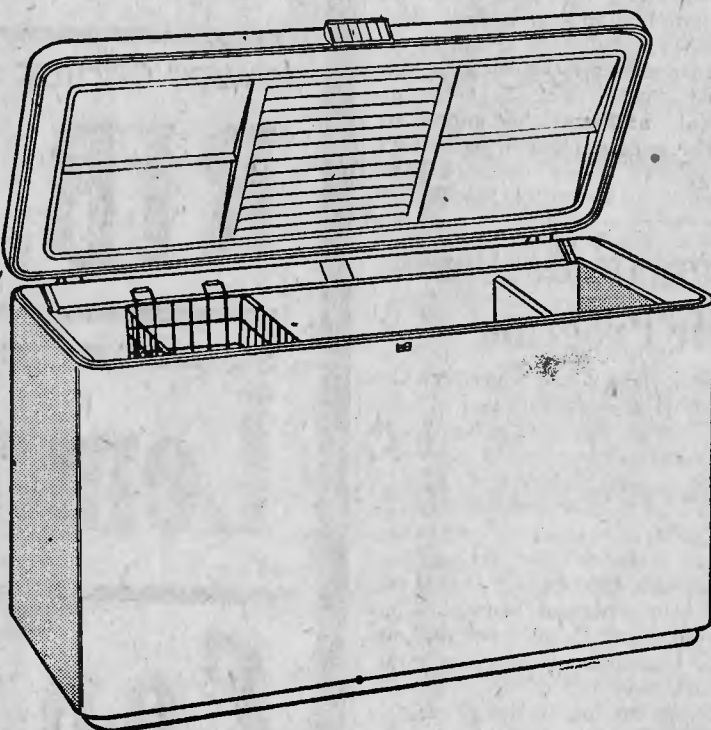
