

General Assembly Report

At Hearing
A number of Moore County people attended the public hearing on Tuesday before the House and Senate Finance Committees on the Firemen's Pension Fund Bills. Those from Moore whom we saw at the hearing included H. W. Jackson and J. W. Phillips of Carthage; Elmer Renegar, L. S. Rowell and Stanley Dunn of Southern Pines; J. D. McLean, Hugh Styers and A. J. Smith of Aberdeen; Frank McCaskill and George Veno of Pinehurst. There is considerable interest in the proposed Firemen's Pension Bill which would provide pensions for firemen with 30 years of service and at least 55 years of age.

Scott Portrait
On Thursday night of last week the portrait of the late U. S. Senator and former Governor W. Kerr Scott was presented to the State at a joint meeting of the House and Senate. The presentation address was made by Terry Sanford of Fayetteville and Governor Hodges accepted the portrait in behalf of the State. Mrs. Kerr Scott and sons Osborne and Robert W., and a daughter, Mrs. Alfred J. Lowdermilk, Jr., were on hand for the presentation. The house chamber, lobby and gallery were filled for the occasion. While I am no judge of painting, I did not think the portrait did justice to the Squire of Haw River.

Farrells

Welfare
I have had a number of communications from Moore County requesting increased appropriations for the Welfare Department that more funds may be available for hospital care of indigent patients. I feel sure that more money will be appropriated for this purpose than was recommended by the Governor and the Advisory Budget Commission. Senator Wilbur Currie of Moore has taken the lead in the move for more appropriations for this purpose.

Poultry Laboratory
On Monday night I introduced a bill to provide funds for a poultry diagnostic laboratory to be located in Moore County. If the appropriations are voted it will be contingent upon the county or one of its municipalities providing the land and building. The request for such a laboratory was made by Robbins people who have indicated their willingness to cooperate in every way possible.

Duke Seminary Student To Conduct Recreation Program In West End

Robert Know, a rising senior in the Seminary at Duke University, will head the summer recreation program in West End, according to the Rev. Ralph Fowlkes, chairman of West End's Recreation Council.

Mr. Know, an honor student, has already served one summer in recreational work under a plan sponsored by the Duke Endowment. Under that plan seminary students each summer are awarded work scholarships and are sent out to gain practical experience in recreational and other community activities.

Prior to enrolling at Duke Mr. Know was graduated from Marshall College in Huntington, W. Va.

During the 10 weeks of the recreation program in West End he will work under the direction of Mr. Fowlkes in a schedule that has activities for people of all ages.

Beginning June 11 and running through June 19 there will be a community wide Vacation Church School at the Methodist Church.

Other activities include a Pony League, instruction in swimming, a teen age club for high school and college students, a sub-teen club for students 12 to 12 years of age, a Golden Age Club for elderly residents, and activities for pre-school children.

The Recreation Council is composed of representatives of all civic organizations in the community. Members are Mrs. A. P. Farmer and Mrs. D. D. Richard-

son of the Woman's Club; Mrs. Bob Youngblood and Mrs. Everette Cole of the Sandspur Club; North Lewis of the Fire Department; Tommy McNeill of the community at large; Earl Auman of the Lions Club, and the Rev. George Houck.

Civic organizations, business firms and private individuals will be asked to make contributions for support of the program.

Head Named City Manager Of Canton
Gary Head, a former Town Clerk and assistant manager of Southern Pines, has been named City Manager of Canton and will assume his new duties later this month. Head, City Manager of Carolina Beach for the past 17 months, will be the first City Manager Canton has ever had. Hazel Ramsey, Canton Mayor, said that applications for the post had been received from both Carolinas, Florida and Tennessee. Canton is the home of Champion Paper Company, one of the nation's largest, and is near the Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

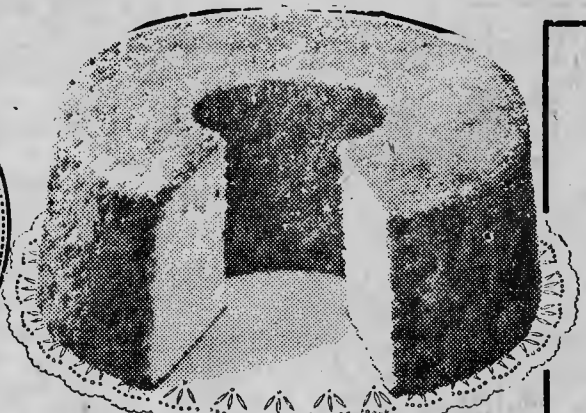
