Fire Fighters Of County Heard At Budget Session

J. A. Pippin of Rockingham, district forester, and Travis Wickler, Moore County forest warden, made their annual appearance before the Moore Board of County Commissioners last week seeking funds for the next fiscal year. The total amount requested of the county was \$9,458.40, a figure which Mr. Pippin said was extremely low when compared to the amount of work and protection it provided.

The State, he said, would appropriate as its share of the budget of \$23,646, a total of \$14,187.60.

The commissioners will probably go along with the budget, observers felt. Not in anyone's memory have they turned down the fire requests which, unlike others, generally remain about the same from year to year.

The funds would have provisions for \$10,489 for salaries of the ranger, smokechaser and field mechanic. Other funds will be used for wages of tower operators, tractor operators, smokechasers, equipment, and main-

Golfers in the area got some good news this week: Pinehurst's No. 2 course will be open for play throughout the summer.

The other three courses there will be closed, however. No. 4 closed last week and the other two are to be closed Monday, May 18.

In Southern Pines, the Country Club will be open throughout the summer but the other two, Mid Pines and Pine Needles, are expected to close as soon as the convention season ends.
