

TO THE PEOPLE OF SOUTHERN PINES

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in liberating the Bramac Strip from illegal occupation by the capitalist satellite government of North Salada it has become necessary for Peoples Volunteer Forces of Mountainia and Mountainia Volunteer Brigade under my command to occupy the city of Southern Pines, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of Peoples Volunteer Forces acting in the interest of Mudlin solidarity to extirpate the capitalist-sponsored government of North Salada from the Bramac Strip and restore that territory to its Motherland, Mountainia, and

WHEREAS, in order to reorient the currently prevailing decadent philosophy inspired by foreign capitalist elements toward vigorous and progressive materialism consistent with the dynamic teachings of the great Aggressor Leader and head of the International Circle Trigon Party, and

WHEREAS, to establish law and order and to provide security of my troops it is necessary to establish Military Government in the occupied territory. Now therefore I, Felix Desperato, General of Brigade, General Officer Commanding the Mountainian Volunteer Brigade and Military Governor of the territory occupied by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Supreme Leader of the Mountainian Peoples Volunteers, do hereby proclaim as follows:

All power of government and jurisdiction in the occupied territory and over its inhabitants, and final administrative responsibility are vested in me as General Officer Commanding and Military Governor, and the office of Military Government is established to exercise these powers under my direction.

All persons in the occupied territory will obe promptly all orders given by me or under my authority and must refrain from all acts hostile to the troops under my command or helpful to our enemies, from all acts of violence, and from any act calculated to disturb public order in any way.

Your existing laws will remain in force and effect except in so far as it may be necessary to change or supersede them by proclamation or order issued by me or under my authority.

All Southern Pines civil and criminal courts and educational establishments will be closed until further orders of the office of the Military Government.

All administrative and judicial officials of the city of Southern Pines and all other government and political functionaries and employees of federal, state and municipal government(s) residing in occupied territory will present themselves at the Office of Military Government located in the Southern Pines Municipal Center within twenty-four (24) hours after publication of this proclamation.

Further proclamations, orders, regulations and notices issued by me or under my authority from time to time, will specify what is further required of you, and what you are forbidden to do, and these will be displayed in the Courthouse, Police station, Post office, or other prominent public places.

So long as you remain peaceable and comply with my orders, you will be subjected to no greater interference than may be inevitable in view of military and political exigencies.

About 8 o'clock this morning a highly trained band of Mountainian troops numbering 150 foot soldiers and paratroopers engaged North Saladian troops in heavy battle on the Veterans of Foreign Wars property just north of the business section. Details of the battle are still cloaked, necessarly, in military secrecy, but it was reported that the North Saladians put up light resistance in the skirmish, which was fought mostly with small arms and light artillery. No report on casualties is available.

All persons are further warned that military guards are instructed to shoot any person seen outside the limits of his premises after curfew attempting to hide or escape.

NEWTON was forced at gunpoint earlier this morning to broadcast a proclamation to the people of Southern Pines of General of the Brigade Felix Desperato, who has assumed full control of the government. Chief Newton, who failed to cooperate with the Mountainian troops now in control of the Town Hall, has been lodged in jail awaiting trial,
