That elusive line which divides McNeill and Sandhills Townships has finally been pinned down but Southern Pines officials have indicated they're just as displeased now as they have been in the past.

The principal problem still exsts: some people who are residents of Southern Pines, which is in McNeill Township for the most part, are still within the boundaries or Sandhills Township and required to vote there in all but town elections.

The new map, drawn under the supervision of Clarence Blue, county surveyor, with the assistance of several other surveyors, puts the township boundary line roughly along Morgan-ton Road. 
