Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines at regular session assembled this the 14th day of July, 1959, as follows:

Section I, Chapter Q, Article IV, "Regulating the Taking of Fish From Water Works Lake," be and is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 17, Fees. The Following fees are hereby prescribed for fishing privileges in the Southern Pines Water Works Lake: Annual permit: Town residents, \$5.00, non-residents, \$10.00. One time permit: non-resident visitors accompanied by one holding an annual permit, \$1.00. In addition to the above fees, annual permit holders will pay to the Water Plant Attendant a fee of \$.50 per day. No charge shall be made for persons under twelve years of age accompanied by one holding a permit.

Arthur Twombly, Retired House Painter, Dies

Arthur C. Twombly, 66, died at Moore Memorial Hospital Saturday night.

According to his request, the body was cremated and there were no funeral services.

Mr. Twombly came to this state from New Hampshire. He and his family settled on a farm, east of Manly, nearer thirty than twenty years ago. He had worked on the grounds and buildings of a good many residents of this town.

The farm had been purchased originally because of his wife's sister, who was the wife of Preacher J. Fred Stimson. The Twombly farm adjoined the Stimson farm and the old Powell Orchard. Here on his land, Mr. Twombly raised his garden truck and took care of his livestock: chickens, pigs, goats and whatever else he could manage on his small farm.

A true son of the soil, he spent his days making things grow: useful things and pretty things. He had a green thumb and much instinctive knowledge of the ways of nature. Mr. Twombly gave of his knowledge to others as he worked for various gardeners and homeowners of the Sandhills, whose flowers and shrubs will now miss his touch and whose owners miss his salty cheerful conversation.

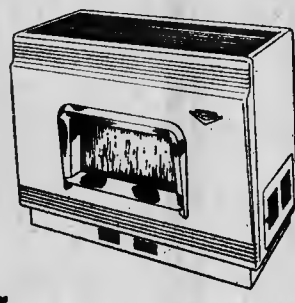

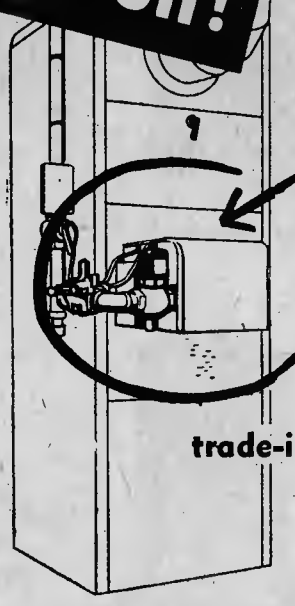
