Moore Recorder's Court Has Short Session Saturday

Cases heard, by Judge J. Vance Rowe in a short session of Moore County Recorder's Court at Carthage on Saturday were:

Jerry Bradley, Eagle Springs, driving without operator's license and lights, prayer for judgment continued on payment of \$25, to include costs, not to drive on a highway until he obtains operator's license; Gerald Dean Harper, Greensboro, speeding 75 in 55 zone, \$25 and costs.

Russell Goins, Carthage, trespass, disturbing peace, cursing, profane language, prayer for judgment continued for 30 days on following conditions: have self examined by a physician to determine mental condition and obey recommendation of doctor as to treatment, then report to the court either personally or by attorney on the first Monday of August, with the doctor's findings.

Leonard Elijah Wood, Carthage, malicious destruction of personal property, disorderly conduct, at request of prosecuting witnesses (defendant's wife and stepmother), prayer for judgment continued for 12 months on payment of costs and on condition of good behavior, not to get drunk and cause trouble at home or elsewhere during the 12 months period.

Several other cases on the docket were continued or capias were ordered issued after defendants did not appear.

RESOLUTION OF ASSIGNMENT SOUTHERN PINES CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION

The following resolution was proposed by Mr. York, seconded by Mr. Sandlin, and duly adopted by the Board:

WHEREAS, The Board previously adopted rules and regulations governing assignments and change of assignments for the children in this administrative unit to best promote an orderly and efficient procedure for making applications for assignment or change of assignment;

AND WHEREAS, The Board has the duty and final responsibility for assigning the children in this administrative unit to a school;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Southern Pines City Board of Education in order to best promote the orderly and efficient administration of the public schools in this unit, the effective instruction of the pupils subject to assignment by this Board, and the health, safety and general welfare of such pupils, and each of them, hereby assigns the children of this administrative unit as follows:

- A. (1) Each child who attended a school in the Southern Pines Administrative Unit during the school year 1959-60 is assigned to the same school for the year 1960-61.
- (2) All other children will be assigned to a school upon request for admission when received by the Board.
- B. FOR the school year 1960-61, the parents of any child of school age who desire that such child attend a specific school other than the school to which he has been assign-

ed shall file written application to the Board of Education through the superintendent of schools provided by the general rules and regulations as adopted by this Board. Failure to file such an application on or before July 25, 1960, shall indicate satisfactory assignment made by the Board of Education. j7,14c

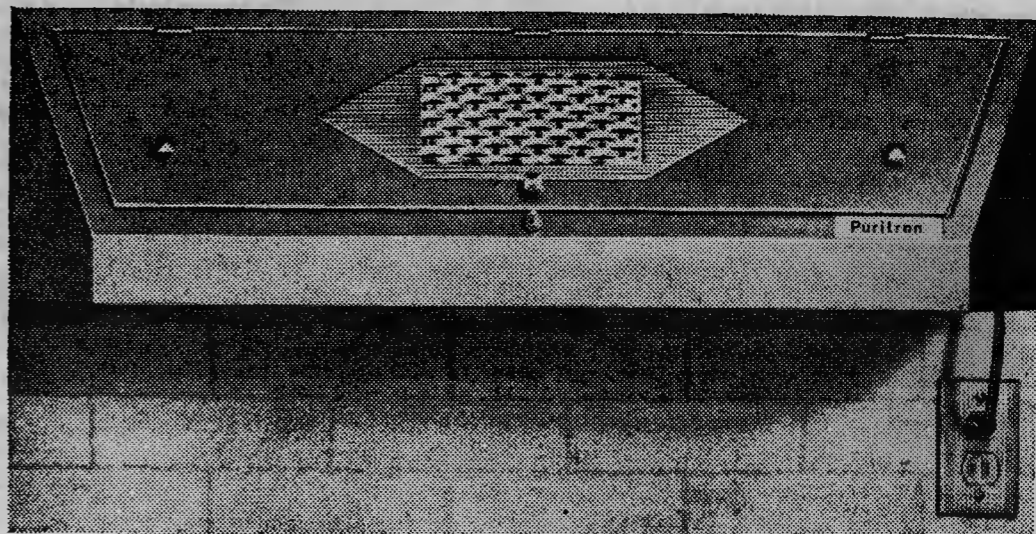

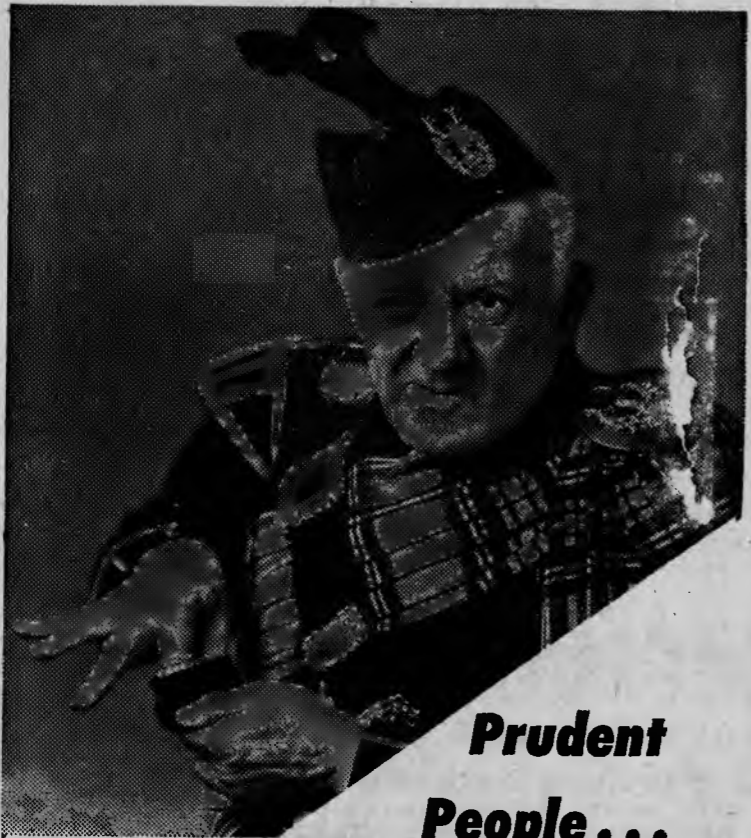
