





He will be taught rifle marksmanship under the U.S. Army's Trainfire program, which enable the modern soldier to become a better rifleman in less time than previous methods. In this program, most of his training consists of firing his rifle at pop-up targets at various unknown distances on terrain which duplicates combat areas. Other highlights of his intensive training include squad tactics, bayonet and hand-to-hand combat, and crawling the infiltration course while actual machine gun fire is popping overhead. Many of his instructors are combat veterans of World War II and the Korean War.

As a climax to this first phase of training, he will march with his battalion in a review before the commanding general of Fort Jackson. This ceremony is witnessed by relatives and friends of trainees who attend the "open house" held by each company on graduation day.
