VA Issues Statement Regarding Soliciting

Door-to-door solicitors implying they represent the Veterans Administration or have the endorsement of the VA for a product are acting without permission or authority.

This statement was issued by J. D. DeRamus, Winston-Salem Regional Office manager, in response to inquiries from individuals and groups seeking verification of verbal statements made by agents soliciting subscriptions or funds, or selling products in behalf of veterans.

Mr. DeRamus added that the VA neither endorses nor condemns door-to-door solicitations in behalf of veterans, but it advises those who may suspect claims made in such endeavors to check with their Better Business Bureau or any community organization acting in that capacity.

"The VA does not endorse any product, project or commercial endeavor for the profit of individuals, organizations, or corporations," Mr. DeRamus said.

With the Armed Forces

Army Sergeant First Class Sherman J. Hussey, son of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert E. Hussey, Carthage, recently participated with other personnel from the 8th Infantry Division's 504th Infantry in Exercise Jumping Jack in Germany.

The nine-day exercise featured a mass airborne assault on territory held by a simulated aggressor force. Over 2,500 paratroopers took part in the drop, which was designed to test the combat efficiency of the participating units.

Sergeant Hussey is a squad leader in the 504th's Company A in Mainz. He entered the Army in 1951 and arrived overseas on his tour of duty in December, 1958.

The sergeant, whose wife, Shirley, is with him in Germany, is a graduate of Pinckney High School.

Army Pvt. Howard T. Medlin, son of Mr. and Mrs. Howard P. Medlin, Route 3, Carthage, recently was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, Ky.

Medlin, a radio operator in Company C of the division's 327th Infantry, entered the Army in June, 1960, and completed basic training at Fort Jackson, S. C.

The 19-year-old soldier was graduated from Vass-Lakeview High School in 1960.
