Out in New Form**

The first issue in new format of "The Searcher" a monthly magazine published by the Psychic Observer, Inc., with offices in Southern Pines, has appeared.

Tom O'Neil of 110 Highland Road, editor and publisher, said that the new, smaller size replaces the former "Searcher," a publication with nation-wide circulation.
