BE IT ORDAINED AND ESTABLISHED by the Town Council of the Town of Southern Pines in regular session assembled this the 10th day of October, 1961, as follows:

1. That that area of land lying adjacent to and contiguous with the corporate limits of the Town of Southern Pines be and the same hereby is incorporated into and made a part of the Town of Southern Pines, said area being as follows:

TRACT NO. 1—BEGINNING at a concrete monument located in the western boundary of Pee Dee Road S 22 degrees

44' W 1056 feet from the southwest corner of the intersection of said Pee Dee Road and Midland Road in the Town of Southern Pines; continuing thence along said Pee Dee Road S 22 degrees 44' W 860.2 feet to a concrete monument; thence following arc of curve from Pee Dee Road into Fairway Road tangent of which is S 50 degrees 15' W 213.4 feet to a concrete monument in northern boundary of Fairway Road; thence along said boundary of Fairway Road S 77 degrees 52' W 606.8 feet to the boundary of Pennsylvania Avenue Extended; thence along said Pennsylvania Avenue Extended N 36 degrees 45' W 1014.9 feet to a concrete monument;

thence N 14 degrees 17' E 708.25 feet to a concrete monument; thence continuing along said line N 14 degrees 17' E 1002.2 feet to the Southern boundary of Midland Road; thence along said boundary of Midland Road S 77 degrees 39' E 307.6 feet to a marker; thence continuing farther along said Midland Road S 74 degrees 54' E 446.2 feet to a concrete monument; thence about S 17 degrees 30' W about 1025 feet to a concrete monument; thence S 73 degrees 40' E about 941 feet to the point of BEGINNING, containing 53.6 acres, more or less.

TRACT NO. 2—ALL of Lot No. 87 as shown on map of

Midland Farms Subdivision, which map is duly recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for Moore County.

2. From and after the effective date of the Annexation Ordinance, the territory and its citizens and property shall be subject to all debts, laws, ordinances and regulations in force in the Town of Southern Pines and shall be entitled to the same privileges and benefits as other parts of said Town.
