

Suspended Terms Given Youth For Speeding Offenses

Charles S. Jones, 19-year-old youth, drew two 30-day jail sentences, suspended on payment of \$75 fine each and costs, in Moore County Superior Court last week on two counts of excessive speed, both offenses occurring on the same night.

The cases came up from the Southern Pines Recorders Court where Jones, indicted for speeding 90 miles per hour on one count, 95 miles per hour on the other, had asked for jury trials. In Superior Court he tendered pleas of guilty to speeding in excess of 75, which the State accepted, consolidating the cases

Both offenses occurred the night of October 31, when according to testimony of Southern Pines police officers, Jones had first shot through town heading south at more than 90 miles per hour, then later had come back through heading north at around 95. The police car, pursuing him
