Sawmill Safety Meeting Set at Carthage Hotel

Two in a series of meetings being held throughout the State to promote safety in the sawmill industry will be held at Lumberton and at Carthage February 28 and March 1.

Sponsored by the N. C. Forestry Association with headquarters at Raleigh, the meetings are being held in an effort to earn reductions in the workmen's compensation rate for sawmills. Both the Lumberton and the Carthage meetings will begin with a dutch supper at 6:30 p. m. with a formal program at 7:30. The Lumberton meeting will be held at Johnson's Restaurant, while the Carthage Hotel will be the site of the Carthage gathering.

Safety engineers from the N. C. Department of Labor and from the insurance industry will be present to lead a discussion on safety techniques in sawmill operations. Both meetings will be open to the public.

Since the N. C. Forestry Association launched its safety program in 1959, two substantial reductions in the workmen's compensation rate have been realized in the logging industry. Similar results are the objective of the recently-launched safety program for sawmills.

T. G. Harris of Roanoke Rapids is president of the N. C. Forestry Association and Robert L. Smith of Washington, N. C. heads the Association's Insurance and Safety Committee.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION TOWN OF VASS, NORTH CAROLINA

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election will be held in the Town of Vass, North Carolina, on the 27th day of March, 1962, for the purpose of submitting the question whether the qualified voters of said Town shall approve the indebtedness to be incurred by the issuance of bonds of said Town of the maximum principal amount of \$146,000 to finance the enlargement and extension of the water supply system maintained and operated by said Town by the erection of a water filter plant including the acquisition of the lands or rights in land and the necessary equipment and apparatus required therefor, and a tax to be levied for the payment thereof, and also the bond ordinance adopted by the Board of Commissioners of said Town on January 8, 1962, which authorized the issuance of said bonds for such purpose and the levy of such tax.

The ballots to be used at said election shall contain the words "For the ordinance authorizing \$146,000 of bonds to finance the erection, by the Town of Vass, of a water filter plant including the acquisition of the lands or rights in land and the necessary equipment and apparatus required therefor, and a tax therefor."

In the event that the qualified voters approve the indebtedness to be incurred by the issuance of said bonds and the tax therefor and said ordinance, the bonds authorized by such ordinance will be issued for the purpose stated and an annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds will be levied.

The polls for said election will open at the hour of 6:30 o'clock, A. M., and will close at the hour of 6:30 o'clock, P. M. (Eastern Standard Time).

The polling place for said election shall be the usual polling place in the Town of Vass, namely: The Fire Station.

The Board of Commissioners, has appointed Miss Bessie Cameron to act as Registrar and Mrs. Howard Callahan and Mrs. Charles Geschwind to act as Judges of Election for said election.

The Registrar will be furnished with the registration book used at the last regular election held in the Town of Vass (being the regular municipal election held on May 2, 1961) and she will revise the registration book so that it will show an accurate list of the electors previously registered in the Town and still residing therein without requiring such electors to register anew. The Registrar will keep the registration book open for the registration of new electors on each day (Sundays and holidays excepted) for the period beginning, Friday, the 9th day of March, 1962, and ending on Saturday, the 17th day of March, 1962. The books will be kept open on each Saturday during such period from 9 o'clock, A. M., until 9 o'clock, P. M., Eastern Standard Time, and on other days during such period from 9 o'clock, A. M., until 5 o'clock, P. M., Eastern Standard Time. The registration book will be kept open at the polling place hereinbefore named on Saturday, the 17th day of March, 1962, for the inspection of electors and any of such electors shall be allowed to object to the name of any person appearing on said book.

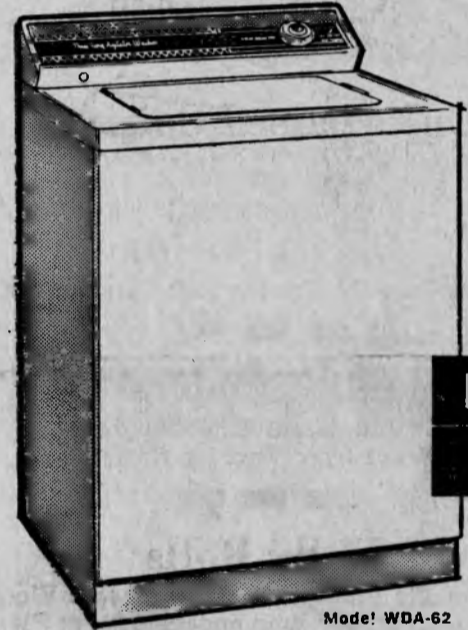
