## 'Send Me No Flowers' Draws Laughs This Week at Pinehurst Playhouse

"Send Me No Flowers," the Pinehurst Playhouse's offering of the week, is a rather thin type of joke stretched out over three acts, which is too far, but the joke is told with zest and a new and engaging personality is introduced to Sandhills playgoers.

Wolfington, well-known comedian of "The Music Man," with Robert Preston, on Broadway, is a chubby, cheerful charmer who wrings the chuckles from the slimmest lines. As George Kimball, a hypochondriac husband who thinks he's going to die in a couple of weeks, he gets all fouled up in self-pity and

heroics. When his error is uncovered, he gets all snarled up again trying to right matters with an indignant wife.

The gruesome premise gets in the way of the hilarity at times but "Iggie" squeezes out the laughs anyway, and so does Joan DeWeese, who as Judy, the wife, is not only beautiful but proves herself a slick comedienne. Funniest bits are the Walter Mitty-type dreams in which both indulge on occasion as their frustration with each other heightens.

J. Talbot Holland as the erstwhile college pal whom "Iggie" picks out to be Judy's second husband is pretty funny too. It's a comedy of New York's Exurbia, slickly produced with highly professional cast, others of whom are Charles Waterman, James Wann, Bruce Hall, Henry Strozler, Bob Langton, James Bate-man, Dean Delk, Bruce Craig and Correlia Johnson. Lynn Pecktal has done a delightful and colorful set.

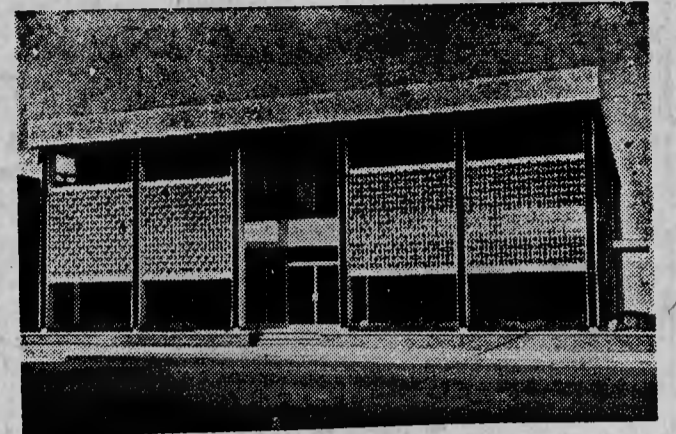
Frank Staples and David Morgan are looking into the possibility of sponsoring an Easter-egg hunt for children the Saturday before Easter, April 21.

## THEATRE SUNRISE

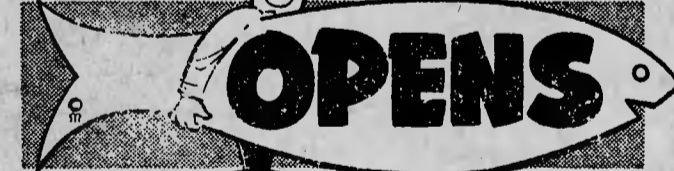

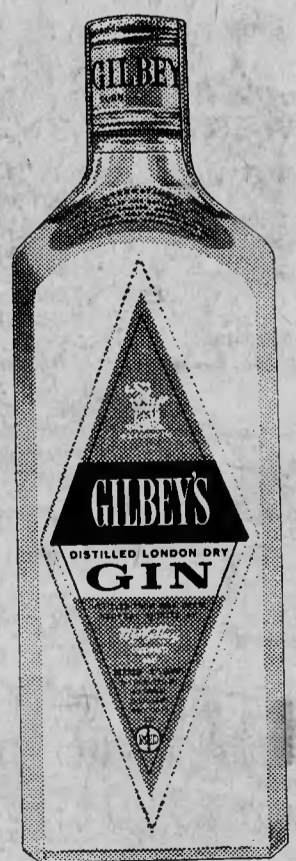
