MOORE COUNTY RECORDER'S COURT

Young Defendants Are Charged With Traffic Offenses in Monday Session

Young defendants charged with traffic offenses played a prominent part in Moore County Recorder's Court at Carthage Monday.

Cases heard by Judge J. Vance Rowe were:

Alvin Underwood Fry, 17, Carthage, speeding 70 in 55-mile zone, \$15 and costs; Jerry Kenneth Sheffield, Route 1, Eagle Springs, drunken driving, 60 days on the roads, suspended on payment of \$100 fine and costs, driver's license to be revoked for 12 months; Roger Dale Simpson, 19, Route 1, Carthage, exceeding safe speed, judgment continued on payment of \$10 and costs; Forrest Lee Hawley, 21, speeding 70 in 55 zone, judgment continued on payment of \$15 fine and costs; Laurier C. A. Constant, 18, Fort Bragg, careless and reckless driving resulting in accident with personal injury, judgment continued on payment of \$25 fine and costs.
