Nurses Attend Conference On Disaster Nursing

Two staff nurses from Moore Memorial Hospital are in Wilmington this week, attending a state nursing conference.

Miss Lalan Patterson, assistant director of nurses, and Mrs. Jane Caviness, who heads the emergency department staff, are meet-

ing with other hospital nursing personnel at the Disaster Nursing Institute being held in the port city. Opening Tuesday and continuing through today, the schedule of the conference, promoted by the North Carolina State Nursing Association, covers all aspects of disaster emergency nursing and hospital care.

Special features of the study include: technical aspects of the care of mass casualties, with special attention to the treatment of burns, psychological and traumatic injuries and respiratory problems. A film centering around the after-effects of the Hiroshi-

ma and Nagasaki bombings and the medical care of the survivors will be shown. The final session will feature a demonstration of fire fighting and mass hospital evacuation carried out by the Wilmington Fire Department and student nurses of James Walker Hospital.

In describing the course which the local nurses are attending, Mrs. K. A. McLeod, director of nurses at Moore Memorial, emphasized that the chief aim of the conference is to promote awareness among nurses and allied hospital personnel of the tremendous responsibilities they must be

prepared to assume in the event of sudden mass disaster.

"This could be any great disaster," Mrs. McLeod said, "not necessarily the kind of thing we may all have in mind these days. We want to prepare ourselves and also we hope by this conference to initiate creative planning in whatever nurses may be called on to do."
