MOORE COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT

Non-Suits Granted in 2 Civil Cases; Seven Uncontested Divorces Allowed

Judge Robert M. Gambill of North Wilkesboro, presiding over the current civil term of Moore Superior Court, granted defense motions for non-suit in two successive cases Tuesday, on the grounds that in neither trial had the plaintiff made out a case.

One, which began Monday, was Fred B. Monroe vs. A. Allen McDonald et al, a controversy over a tract of land in Mineral Springs township, the plaintiff seeking to have a deed set aside as invalid and to be declared owner of the land.

The other, Cleveland Patterson vs. Nathaniel Cole and Nathaniel Cole, Jr., claim of damages as result of an automobile accident of 1960, at Jackson Hamlet.

On Monday, the opening day, seven uncontested divorces were granted, while a mistrial was declared in the case of Joseph Locke McMillan vs. Eula Mae Davis Mc-

Millan. Those granted were: Peggy Elizabeth Oakley by next friend T. W. Evans vs. Martin Lynn Oakley; Rousmaniere Lee vs. Roland Kato Lee; Hazel Lucille Roderick vs. Joseph William Roderick, Jr.; Uneva Sue Brewer vs. Shelton Cleo Brewer; George McRae vs. Evelyn McRae; Daniel Hogan vs. Josephine R. Hogan; and Josephine Allen Turner vs. Grady Turner.

In the first jury trial, Mrs. A. McN. Blue, widow of Dr. Blue, was declared to be the owner in possession, of 20½ acres, part of the old A. H. McNeill home tract. Defendants were "all known and unknown heirs of George W. McNeill, deceased."

The case of Lee's Stores (LeRoy LeRoy) vs. John Caddell was continued by the judge over protest of the plaintiff and his attorney, duly recorded.

Other cases are calendared.

Buck story has been transferred successfully to the screen in Leo McCarey's epic of faith, courage, innocence and beauty, "Satan Never Sleeps." The 20th Century-Fox CinemaScope-DeLuxe Color drama, set in China of today, stars William Holden, France Nuyen and Clifton Webb and arrives Sunday at the Sunrise Theatre.

This turbulent story describes the unique relationship between two priests and a young Chinese maiden who takes refuge in their mission. Since these men of the cloth represent freedom and love to the poor villagers of Kwangtung, they are tortured, ridiculed and shamed in attempts to make them forsake their faith.
