Local Boys Will Attend University Science Meeting

Two students at East Southern Pines High School are among 155 top students from across North Carolina who will attend a Junior Science and Humanities Symposium at the University of North Carolina March 14-16, starting at 6:30 p.m.

The local students—chosen for their outstanding abilities in science and humanities—are: Lin B. Dunn and Charles B. Lewis, who will be accompanied to the sixth annual event by Daniel Kruger, Science teacher at the school.

The coming symposium will attract students from virtually every county in the state and will be highlighted by the presentation by six students of theoretical scientific papers selected from entries from throughout the state.

The symposium is the joint enterprise of the army and private enterprise, undertaken in 1958 to stir the interest of high school students in scientific fields.

A nationwide program, with symposia scheduled in 17 states this year, it will be followed by a national gathering at West Point, N. Y., in April.

Delegates to the Tar Heel event are expected to stay at the Jack Tar Hotel in Durham.

North Carolina has about 191,000 farms, a number exceeded only by Texas. The average size is 83 acres (whereas in Texas it is about 630 acres). This large number of small farms is due mainly to the fact that many industrial workers operate farms in their spare time. About 26,000 farms are sharecropped.
