Private Edgar M. Talbert, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank R. Talbert, Niagara, has been assigned to Company C, 19th Battalion, 5th Training Regiment, Fort Jackson, S. C., for eight weeks of basic combat training. This is his first

phase of six months active duty training with the U. S. Army and a part of the obligation he incurred upon enlisting in the Army National Guard's 198th Infantry, Co. D, of Southern Pines.

He will be taught marksmanship, squad tactics, bayonet and hand-to-hand combat, and crawling the infiltration course while live machine-gun fire is popping overhead.

Curtis E. Wall, son of Mr. and Mrs. Curtis Wall of Route 2, Cameron, is undergoing nine weeks of basic recruit training at the Naval Training Center, Great Lakes, Ill.

The indoctrination began early in February and consists of physical fitness drills, military drills, seamanship, basic military law, customs and etiquette of the naval service, swimming and survival, and first aid.

**CLOTHING PRICES**

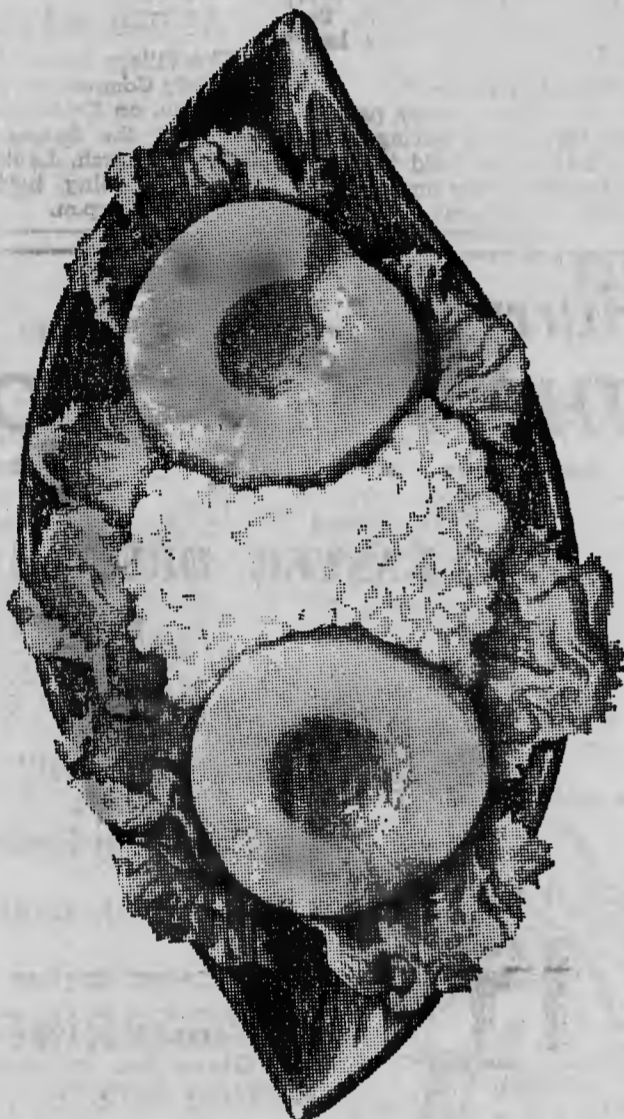
