Southern Pines Recorders Court

Hinsley, Lakeview, allowing unlicensed person to drive, \$25 and costs; Clyde Junior Luster, Pinehurst, no operator's license, not guilty, same defendant, disobeying stop sign, \$10 and costs; Robert Johnson, Sanford, allowing unlicensed person to drive, \$25 and costs; Thomas G. Gibson, driving without valid operator's license (glasses required), pay costs and walk to Howard Johnson's (between Southern Pines and Aberdeen) and back (walking option offered defendant in lieu of paying fine, ac-

ording to custom of the court); James Chisholm, Charlotte, speeding 50 in 35 zone, \$15 and costs; Emmal Lee Small, Route 7, Jonesboro, no operator's license, \$25 and costs.

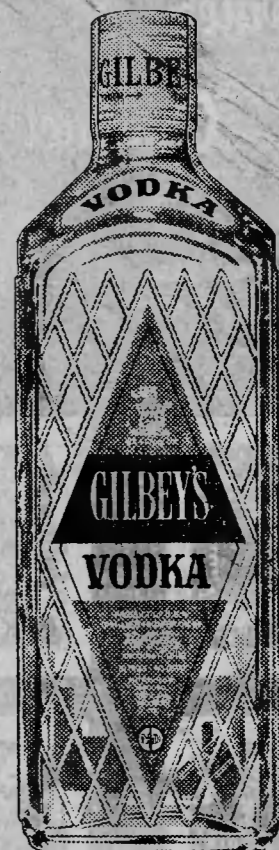
