61ST AT PINEHURST CLUB

Field Of 32 Starts Monday In N-S Women's Championship

The 61st North & South Invitational Golf Championship for Women gets underway here Easter Monday, April 15, when top women amateurs open play at the Pinehurst Country Club.

The title goes undefended as last year's finalist, Clifford Ann Creel, has joined the professional ranks.

The field is limited to 32, with no qualifying round and contestants will be seeded for match play by the tournament committee.

The finals are on Friday, one round of 18 holes will be played each day on the Championship No. Two course, which calls for very accurate second shots. Rated among the 10 best anywhere, for women's play it has been trimmed to around 6,000 yards with par 37-37-74.

Back for another try at the title will be 1962 runner-up Mrs. Helen Sigel Wilson of Gladwyne, Pa., twice National Amateur runner-up, five-time top Pennsylvania amateur and nine times Philadelphia champion.

Also returning are last year's semi-finalists, Number One North Carolina player Miss Marge Burns of Greensboro, and Mrs. John M. Dyson of Sugarloaf, Pa., a former Pennsylvania champ.

Strong contenders this year include Nancy Roth of Hollywood, Fla., winner of the Doherty, Palm Beach tournaments and Women's Four-Ball at Orange-

brook; and Phyllis Preuss of Pompano Beach, winner at Ellinor Village, semi-finalist at Palm Beach and Four-Ball finalist with partner Jean Ashley of Chanute, Kan., who is also entered in the North-South.

Mrs. Philip J. Cudone of West Caldwell, N. J., N-S titleist in 1958, is the only former champion entered; while other players in the field include Mrs. Paul Dye, Indianapolis, Ind.; Mrs. Maurice Glick, Baltimore, Md.; Mrs. Joseph A.
