Ray McNally New Editor At 'Golf World' Magazine

Ray McNally has begun work as editor of Golf World magazine of Pinehurst, succeeding Thomas H. O'Neil of Southern Pines who continues his association with the publication as consultant.
McNally, 42, has spent his life in the sports world as a journalist, sportscaster in both radio and television and in promotion. He is a graduate of the University of Missouri. During World War II he served with the Navy, spending time overseas in the south Pacific.

After stints as sports editor of the Borger, Tex., News-Herald and Tucson, Ariz., Daily Citizen, McNally, with his wife, Marcile, published a golf paper, "Fore," serving Texas and the Southwest. He has broadcast baseball, football and basketball. For two years he was executive director of the All America Bowl football game in Tucson. Throughout his sports career he has been a staunch booster for golf.

The McNallys and their daughter, Marcy, 11, are living in the Knollwood Apartments here. O'Neil had been Golf World editor for about the past 10 years, following 30 years with the Associated Press.

FERTILIZING, IRRIGATION, CURING

Quality Of Tobacco Influenced By Production Practices, Agent Says

There are a number of important production practices that influence the quality of flue-cured tobacco:

1. Adequate but not excessive rates of fertilizer. (See Ext. Folder No. 212 available at the county agent's office or Guides for adjusting Fertilizer to Rainfall).
2. Different varieties can be expected to produce tobacco with different physical and chemical properties. Some varieties normally produce a larger percent of slick and immature appearing leaf than others.
3. Avoid over-irrigation. Tobacco that has too much water or has it too often, tends to be pale, slick, low in nicotine, low in oil and low in aroma and flavor.
4. If MH-30 is to be used, remember that excessive rates, early applications and early harvests tend to increase slickness and stiffness in upstalk leaves.
5. Allow all tobacco to become thoroughly ripe before harvest.
6. Follow a relatively slow curing schedule. In many cases, a longer curing time will improve the color, the appearance of ripeness and texture of the leaf as well as the chemical balance.
7. Avoid curing temperatures in excess of 170 F. to prevent scalding and scorching.
8. Do a reasonable job of sorting so that the highest practical grade can be placed on the tobacco.

9. Many factors which encourage fast early growth and uniformity will tend to improve quality, such as: (1) place fertilizer so that fertilizer injury is kept to a minimum; (2) early, frequent replanting; (3) sorting plants; (4) control insects and diseases; and (5) harvest uniformly ripe tobacco.
10. Space and top the crop so as to get about 120,000 to 140,000

leaves per acre. Too close spacing crease starved, shaded and slick or too high topping tends to in-
