



'64 & '65 Tobacco Allotments Can Be Transferred


July 19, 1963, provides for the lease and transfer of 1964 and flue-cured tobacco allotments, it is noted by Walter I. Fields, manager of the Moore County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Office in Car-

The leased allotment can be transferred only to another farm with an allotment of the same kind of tobacco in the county. No one farm may receive more than five acres of leased allotment (prior to any normal yield adjustment) for flue-cured tobacco. Total acreage allotted to a farm after lease and transfer (prior to any normal yield adjustment) shall not exceed 50 percent of the acreage of cropland on such farm. Leases and transfers were in effect in 1962 and 1963. Farmers who leased tobacco in 1963 should be advised that a new lease will have to be entered into for 1964.


