

HOMECOMING GAME COMING FRIDAY

Blue Knights Take First Conference Loss When Defeated 16-6 by Ellerbe

The Southern Pines Blue Knights were set back by the Ellerbe Wildcats 16-6 at Ellerbe for their first loss in conference action. The Wildcats took an early lead, scoring twice in the first quarter, while the Blue Knights scored only once in the game.

Ellerbe took over in the rushing department picking up 195 yards while Southern Pines picked up only 97 yards. The Blue Knights edged the Wildcats in passing, picking up 88 yards while Ellerbe picked up 64.

Ellerbe won the toss and elected to receive. Dan Thomas booted the ball in the end zone and it was brought out to the 20 yard line. Sophomore halfback Guy Webb broke loose for 23 yards and 25 yards. Paul Stewart moved the ball to the eight yard line in several running plays. Phillip Dewitt hammered the line twice for two yards, and on third down he sliced off tackle for the score. Gilbert Dunn flipped a pass to Davis Wright for the extra point.

The Blue Knights returned the ball to the 45 yard line. Three running plays netted seven yards. On fourth down, they elected to try for the first down and didn't get it. The Wildcats took over on the Blue Knights 49 yard line. They moved 14 yards in four running plays. On third down, Gilbert Dunn, the quarterback, faded back and tossed a 35-yard bomb to Dwight Carter for the score. The halfback Phillip Dewitt scored the extra point.

The ball exchanged hands quickly when the Blue Knights and Wildcats both punted. The Blue Knights got the ball on their own 38 yard line. They crossed midfield to the 24 yard line in several running plays. On fourth down Peter Pezzi rolled out and tossed a 24-yard pass to Dan Thomas for a score. The extra point was no good. The score at half time was 14-6.

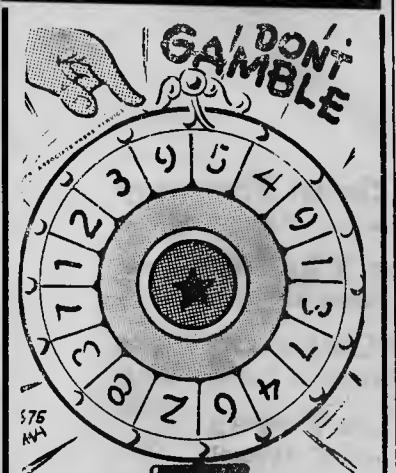
In the second half, it was strictly a defensive battle. In the third quarter, the Wildcats punted down to the Blue Knights' two yard line. Peter Pezzi was nailed in the end zone by the whole Ellerbe line for a safety.

The Blue Knights, late in the fourth quarter marched down to the Ellerbe 18 yard line, but time ran out.

A faithful film re-enactment of the greatest mass escape from a military prison in the annals of warfare, the famed actual break from Germany's maximum security camp the notorious Stalag III by 76 allied airmen during World War II, is the subject of the Mirisch-Alpha presentation "The Great Escape" in Color by DeLuxe and Panavision, opening Sunday at the Sunrise Theatre.

Based upon the non-fiction best-seller by Paul Brickhill, who was a participant in the break, and filmed under the close supervision of C. Wallace Floody, now a Toronto businessman but who was one of the guiding geniuses of the original enterprise, this United Artists release literally has a cast of thousands, headed by Steve McQueen, James Garner and Richard Attenborough.

Stalag III, Floody pointed out to John Sturges, producer and director of "The Great Escape," was created by Germany as a last "get tough" measure for allied airmen after scores of them not only broke out of other prisons but raised havoc with German security and communications behind the lines.
