ONE REPLACES GILMORE
2 St. Andrews Trustees Named

Two new trustees and a budget increase were given to St. Andrews Presbyterian College at Laurinburg, by the Synod of North Carolina at its recent meeting in Montreat.

Named as members of the college's governing board were Mrs. J. Spencer Love of Greensboro and James G. Cannon of Charlotte. They replace two trustees who resigned recently—Mrs. Rufus Wilson of Burlington and Voit Gilmore of Southern Pines.

The synod's budget for 1964-65 will include \$350,000 for St. Andrews, an increase of \$50,000 over the current year's figures. The synod, made up of churches in the major part of North Carolina, owns and operates the college, which has just graduated its third senior class.
