## Vietnamese Officers Have One-Day Tour Of Fort Bragg Units This Week

Three Vietnamese provost marshal officers, headed by the commandant of the I Vietnam Corps Military Police Training Centerland, concluded a one-day orientation tour of the XVIII Airborne Corps, Fort Bragg and 82nd Airborne Division military police units Tuesday.

In the group was Major Nu Van Dan, Commandant of the I Vietnam Corps Military Police Training Centerland and of the I Vietnam Corps Provost Marshal General; Captain Le Huu Duc, Chief of Training Office of the Provost Marshal General; and First Lieutenant Nguyen Van Kinh, Chief Planning Branch, Office of the Provost Marshal General.

The group arrived Monday evening at Grannis Airfield in Fayetteville where it was met by an escort officer from Fort Bragg. Accompanying the group was Major Charles O. Neal, U. S. Army Tour Director.

The trio began their tour of Fort Bragg with a visit to the command section of the XVIII Airborne Corps and a briefing on the Strategic Army Corps (STRAC) Tuesday morning. Next was the tour of the XVIII Airborne Corps and Fort Bragg's Provost Marshal's Office for a description of PMO activities and operations.

Later the officers visited the 82nd and 503rd Military Police Battalions where they were given orientations on military police procedures ranging from staff actions to prisoner of war planning.

The tour was capped with an orientation by the 82nd Airborne Division's military police section where they received briefings on airborne military police techniques and use of communications equipment in provost marshal operations.

The officers departed Fort Bragg and Fayetteville Tuesday after an official dinner in the Hickey Room of the Fort Bragg Officer's Open Mess that evening.

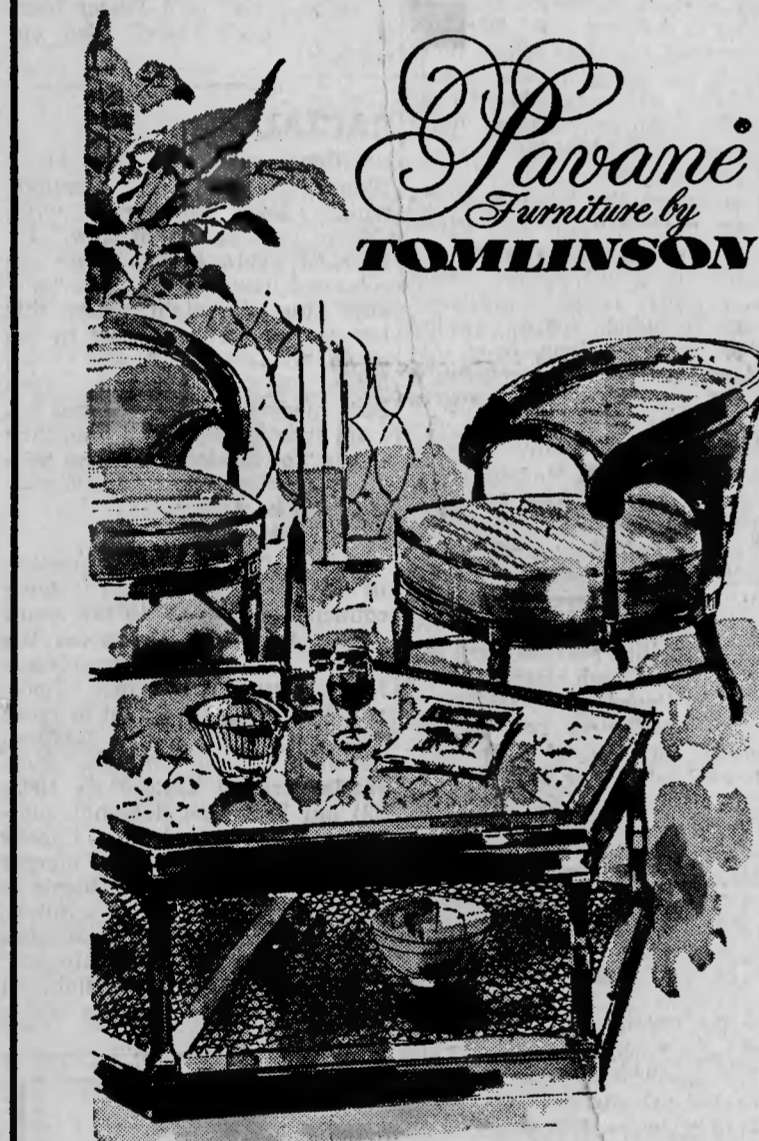
