### LILAC PROBLEMS

A lady called about her lilac plants. She told me that they were strong plants when set and that she used peat and sand mixed with her red clay when they were planted. Now she says that they are old enough to bloom but only one rather weak bloom has appeared.

Lilacs prefer a deep, rich soil and one that is not too acid. I suggested that she have her soil tested and use enough lime to raise the pH to about 6.5 or 7.0. Also, that she fertilize the plants with a good general purpose fertilizer such as 8-8-8.

Generally speaking, lilacs seem to grow better in the upper Piedmont and mountains than in the lower Piedmont and eastern Carolina. They do especially well in "limestone country."

### Azalea Not Growing

Another lady was worried about a nice azalea (Indica) plant which was not growing as it should. I stopped by to see this plant. It was healthy enough but was rather flat-topped as the terminal shoots were not elongating as they should.

After examining the plant I decided that it had been planted too deep. In addition, it was heavily mulched with leaves. This did not pose much of a problem because the plant was easily raised a little with a round pointed shovel and a little extra care.

Azaleas, rhododendrons, camellias, blueberries and other plants in this group are comparatively shallow rooted and will not tolerate deep planting. If the plants are balled and burlapped the top of the ball should be set even with the soil line and then mulched. The same is true for container grown plants. Pine straw is better than leaves or peat because water penetrates more easily.

### Mow Lawn Regularly

Mow your lawn regularly. This is very important. Set the mower to cut the blades of grass at about one and one-half to two inches. This is best for most grasses. Bermuda, Zoysia and other "warm season" grasses may be cut closer.

You may have wet spots in your lawn which need aeration. If the spots are not too large, this job may be accomplished by forcing a spading fork into the soil to a depth of three or four inches. Oxygen is essential for proper root growth on all plants. If you think poor soil aeration may be a problem in your lawn, mechanical aerators may be rented; or you might contact your local yard maintenance man for help.

### NEMATODES

A decade or so ago North Carolina farmers had only limited knowledge of nematodes, worm-like organisms microscopic in size but dynamic in terms of damage they can inflict on tobacco and other crops. Today, the farmer knows about these soil-borne pests and the millions of dollars in damage they inflict each year. What's more important, the farmer now knows how to combat these nematodes.

## REPAIRS HERE, ELSEWHERE URGED

### Grand Jury Recommends 2 Mobile Classrooms At East Side School

The use of two mobile classrooms at East Southern Pines School and numerous repairs at schools and various county buildings were recommended by the Grand Jury, making its report last week to Judge Robert M. Gambill presiding in Moore County Superior Court at Carthage.

The report was signed by H. A. Keith, Grand Jury foreman.

The full text of the report, as submitted, follows:

We, the Grand Jury selected for this Term of Criminal Court, respectfully submit the following report.

After examination of witnesses and in consideration of their sworn testimony on 29 bills of indictment presented, of the 20 bills, 19 were found to be true bills, one continued for lack of witnesses.

We submit the following report on the findings, by a committee selected from the Grand Jury on the condition of the following:

COURT HOUSE May we recommend checking out and replacing of light bulbs.

JAIL May we recommend repairing leaking roof, and plastering and painting of the walls caused by this leaking.

PINCKNEY SCHOOL May we recommend replacing of tile floor in classroom hall and classrooms, and general repairing of windows in gymnasium.

CARTHAGE SCHOOL May we recommend repairing of windows in gymnasium, painting ceiling and posts of walkway and repairing of hot water lines.

ROBBINS PRIMARY SCHOOL — We recommend topsoil on playgrounds, and floors need repair work done in downstairs classrooms.

ELISE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL Found in good condition.

DAVIS SCHOOL Found in good condition, except painting of storage room.

WESTMOORE SCHOOL Found in good condition.

NORTH MOORE SCHOOL Found in good condition.

HIGHFALLS SCHOOL We recommend repair of lunchroom stoves, some don't work.

WEST SOUTHERN PINES SCHOOL We recommend: (a) Repairs needed on gymnasium doors. (b) Windows in gymnasium need replacing. (c) Ceiling tile in various classrooms needs replacing, and walls of gymnasium have not been repaired.

EAST SOUTHERN PINES SCHOOL We recommend two mobile classrooms.
