MOORE COUNTY RECORDER'S COURT

Defendant Appeals Road Sentence For 110 Speed, No Driver License

Bobby Ray Kelly, 33, of Colon, pleading not guilty Monday, in Moore County Recorder's Court at Carthage, to charges of speeding 110 in a 55 zone, and driving without license, was found guilty as charged and received a straight sentence of three months on the roads.

Active road sentences handed out for high speed of 100 miles per hour and above have long been a custom of Judge J. Vance Rowe, the court's regular judge who was presiding Monday.

Kelly gave notice of appeal to Superior Court. Bond was set at \$350.

This was one of a number of traffic law violation cases on the docket. Cases were disposed of as follows:

James Russell Leach, Vass, improper turn, accident, \$25 and costs; James Sherman Stewart, Cameron, Route 2, failing to reduce speed to avoid accident, \$25 and costs; Bobby Berton Phillips, Cameron, Route 1, speeding 70 in 60 zone, driving without lights, \$35 and costs; Joy Lynn Jones, Sanford, careless and reckless driving, failing to stop at stop sign, \$25 and costs; Thomas Paul Guillory, Fayetteville, exceeding safe speed, accident, \$15 and costs.

Robert Leslie Marsh, Carthage, Route 1, careless and reckless driving, \$25 and costs; Leslie James Hill, Pope AFB, speeding 85 in 60 zone, \$60 and costs; William Adair Ashley, Vass, speeding 95 in 55 zone, driving without license, careless and reckless driving, 90 days suspended for two years on payment of \$100 and costs, not to drive car during next 12 months and not then unless he obtains proper license; Henry Earl Wood, Charlotte, speeding 70 in 55 zone, \$20 and costs; Carlton Lee Hardy, Cameron, Route 1, speeding 65 in 55 zone, \$10 and costs.

Floyd Chavis, Jr., Lakeview, driving without license, prayer for judgment continued on payment of \$15 and costs; Philip Steven Nardo, Pinehurst, failing to stop at stop

sign, amended to charge passing another vehicle without giving proper signal, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs.

Geneva Turner, West End, unlawful possession of illicit whiskey for sale, not guilty; Thurman Bell, failure to comply with support judgment, commitment to issue putting 60-day sentence into effect unless defendant pays costs now and arranges with his employer to pay \$20 per week till \$400 in arrears is paid, clerk of court asked to confer with welfare department relative to disbursement of Funds. Clyde Needham, Robbins, non-support of illegitimate child, 60 days suspended on payment of costs and of \$10 now, then \$10 per week, for use and benefit of child till further order.

William Ernest Belton, Niagra, assault and battery on female (wife), prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs, defendant to refrain from assaulting wife; Wilma C. Brown, Jackson Springs, Route 1, disturbing peace, trespass, wilfully and feloniously assaulting three persons with deadly weapon, all cases non-suited; careless and reckless driving, not guilty, defendant found guilty of driving on wrong side of road, prayer for judgment continued on payment of costs.

Local Student Assists NCSU Research Work

An element found in many biologically active compounds is being studied at North Carolina State University in order to determine how it reacts.

Research on sulphur is being undertaken by Dr. William P. Tucker, assistant professor of chemistry at NCSU. The National Science Foundation has allocated \$24,400 for the study.

Graduate students M. Paul Brill of Southern Pines, candidate for a master's degree, and Ph. D. candidate Glenn Roof of Durham, are assisting in the research.

Dr. Tucker pointed out that the research is being conducted in order to understand how sulphur combines with other atoms, in particular, in organic molecules.

He said that sulphur seems to act as a stabilizing agent in other compounds, and the investigation will seek to determine why.

Special Planetarium Programs Set

The Morehead Planetarium, at Chapel Hill will offer in the Sky Theater a special program for very young children entitled "Stars for Beginners," to serve as their introduction to the evening sky. This program will be offered only at 10 am on Wednesdays, July 12, 13 and 26.

During "Stars for Beginners" the Planetarium teacher will point out the bright stars and constellations of the night sky as well as the positions of the moon and planets. The entire night will be condensed into 40 minutes; the turning of the earth and rising of the sun will be explained.

The first 10 minutes of the program will be used to get acquainted, learn about the Planetarium Chamber and how the Planetarium instrument works.

Admissions for this and all Planetarium programs are: children through age 11—45 cents; age 12 through college—65 cents; and adults—90 cents. One adult is admitted free with each 10 children.

Other attractions on these same days are: "Three to the Moon," which is the story of how U. S. Astronauts will reach the moon in Project Apollo (admission required) at 11 am and 3 and 8:30 pm; and exhibits of art and science (featuring a NASA Orbits Demonstrator and the IBM "Mathematics and the Computer").

There is no charge for the exhibits and 30 to 45 minutes should be allowed to tour the building. Groups and individuals may attend programs without advance reservation.

Fitanides Will Start Work With Illinois Company

After completing a year of study in Hotel and Restaurant Management at Florida State University in Tallahassee, Philip Fitanides spent several days in Southern Pines, last week and this week.

He was to go from here for a visit with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Fitanides, in Ogunquit, Maine, until early in August. His father operates the Boston Shoe Shop here in the fall, winter and spring and has a shop in Ogunquit during the summer.

From Ogunquit, Philip Fitanides will go to Chicago where he will work as a management trainee for the John R. Thomson Co., owner of three chains of cafeterias, restaurants and coffee houses in the Mid-West and West, including several large food service operations. The Thompson firm also owns a frozen food company.

The training course will last six months, Fitanides said during his visit here, and if completed successfully will lead to management work in one of the company's establishments.

The local young man is a 1966 graduate of Campbell College at Buies Creek. He became interested in the hospitality and food service fields while doing hotel work in Maine in the summers, he said.

The Florida State University Hotel and Restaurant Management program offers training in all aspects of planning, setting up and operating establishments in these fields.
