

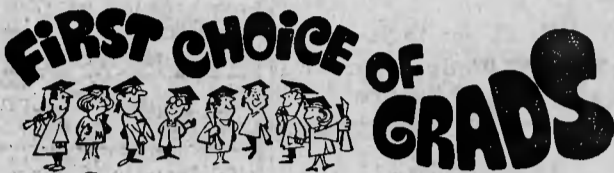

Dr. Moore Speaks At St. Andrews; 2 From Sandhills Area Graduate

Retiring President Ansley C. Moore told a Commencement audience of 1,500 at St. Andrews Presbyterian College, Laurinburg, Sunday that he believes the college is on its way toward fulfilling the hopes of its North Carolina Presbyterian founders and of the educators who helped set its academic pattern.

St. Andrews, Dr. Moore said, and its graduates must continue to come to grips with the problems of handling protest intelligently and of developing individual maturity. Dr. Moore retires June 30 after serving as president since 1960, 18 months before the first classes were held in September, 1961.

In the class of 213 receiving bachelor's degrees were five who earned high honors and eight earning honors.

In detailing the areas for progress, Dr. Moore paid tribute to the youth of today for their abilities and concern. The "quiet majority" of students, Dr. Moore continued, will bring balance to the collegiate scene, remaining sensitive to the problems of the day but forsaking disruptive protest.

Miss Younts To Get A. A. Degree In Danville, Va.

Miss Sandra Younts, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. S. Younts of Southern Pines, will receive the Associate of Arts degree in the Humanities at Stratford College at commencement exercises June 1.

Miss Younts attended East Southern Pines High School for two years and graduated from Graham-Eckes Preparatory School in 1967.

Active in school organizations she was recently elected to the Blazer Club, Stratford's honor organization which promotes interest in athletics and service to the college. In addition she is a member of the Student Youth Fellowship, Le Cercle Francaise (French Club), basketball team, Young Republican Club, hockey team, Stratford College Chorus and Stratford College Madrigals. She was also a feature writer for the school newspaper, the Traveller.

Miss Younts will continue her education at UNC-CH next fall majoring in journalism with training in radio and TV.
