Notice is hereby given that the regular election for three (3) members of the Village Council of Pinehurst, North Carolina, will be held on Tuesday, January 13, 1976. The polls will be open for voting at 6:30 o'clock a.m. and close at 7:30 o'clock p.m., Eastern Standard Time.

The voting will take place in the Village Community House, in the Village of Pinehurst, and at said time and place three (3) members of the Village Council of Pinehurst will be elected for three year terms to succeed the three council members whose two (2) year terms expire on January 13, 1976.

All candidates are required to file in writing with Mary W. Horner, Village Clerk, General Office, Village of Pinehurst, notice of their candidacy on or before 5:00 o'clock p.m., December 10, 1975.

All registered voters of Moore County, North Carolina, who live within the Village boundary of the Village of Pinehurst as described in the North Carolina Session Laws shall be eligible to vote in said election.

The registration books will be open for the registration of new voters in the Village Election and unregistered qualified voters may register with the Moore County Board of Elections at its office in the Currie Building, Carthage, North Carolina, through December 31st, 1975. (The office of the County Board of Elections will be open on Mondays through Friday of each week). Voters properly registered for said election will not be required to re-register.

Any qualified voter of the Village of Pinehurst may vote in this election by absentee ballot if:

1. He expects to be absent from the County during the entire period that the polls are open on the day of said election; or
2. He is unable to be present at the voting place to vote in person on the day of said election in which he desires to vote because of his sickness or other disability.

Voters falling in either of these categories may apply to Mary W. Horner, Village Clerk, General Office, Village of Pinehurst, for absentee ballots not earlier than December 20th, and not later than 5:00 o'clock p.m. on Friday before the election.
