

# Pair Will Face Charges Of First Degree Burglary

Preliminary hearings on first degree burglary charges were conducted for Prentice Thomas and William Junior McAllister last week in Moore County District Court.

Judge Walter Lampley found probable cause to hold both men for grand jury action on the felony charge. They were bound over for the next criminal term of superior court.

Cathy Yvonne Allen waived her right to a hearing on a felony charge of possession of marijuana, and she too was bound over for grand jury action.

She also gave notice of appeal to superior court after she received a suspended sentence for two misdemeanors, carrying a concealed weapon and driving under the influence of drugs. She had pleaded guilty to both charges. The six-month sentence was suspended 12 months on payment of \$150 fine and costs and the conditions that she surrender her driver's license and attend classes at Sandhills Mental Health Center.

Wesley Horner gave notice of appeal when he was found in violation of the terms of probation and was ordered to serve the prison sentence, which had previously been suspended, for misdemeanor charges of assault and battery and breaking and entering. Probation was revoked, and Judge Lampley ordered that

he be permitted to serve the sentence under work release conditions.

Notice of appeal was given by these persons: Larry Donnel Bostick, who pleaded guilty to driving under the influence of alcohol and received a 90-day sentence, suspended 12 months on payment of \$100 fine and costs of court and the conditions that he surrender his driver's license and attend alcohol education classes (a companion charge of transporting non-tax paid liquor was voluntarily dismissed); Jonathan Bonner Sparrow, who pleaded not guilty to DUI but was convicted and sentenced to 90 days, suspended 12 months on payment of \$100 and costs and the conditions that he surrender his license and attend alcohol education classes; Marvin Louis Dowdy, who pleaded not guilty to failure to stop for a red light, was convicted and taxed with \$50.

Others who gave notice of appeal were: Jerry Harold Deaton, who pleaded not guilty to DUI, was convicted and sentenced to 90 days, suspended 12 months on payment of \$100 and costs and the conditions that he surrender his license and attend alcohol education classes; Sammy Ray Reagan, who pleaded not guilty to non-support, was convicted and sentenced to six months, suspended three years on payment of costs and \$50 a week to support his family; Bronzie Harold Lawson III, who pleaded not guilty to careless and reckless driving, was convicted and taxed with a \$10 fine and costs.

Charges of misdemeanor breaking, entering and larceny were consolidated for judgment against Terry Michael Ashburn and William Thomas Beard, who pleaded guilty. Each was sentenced eight to 12 months, suspended 12 months on payment of \$250 fine and costs. They were

placed on probation for 18 months.

Pleading guilty to larceny were Doris Harris, Mattie McDonald, and Bertie Phillips, each of whom was sentenced to six months, suspended 12 months on payment of \$100 and costs. They were placed on probation for 12 months and ordered not to go on the premises of Rolane Factory Outlet.

These persons also pleaded guilty: Ben Bostic, first offense DUI (originally charged with second offense DUI), 90 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, surrender license; Jack Andrew Ledbetter, two counts of no operator's license, 60 days, to be served concurrently with any other sentences he is now serving; Linda Key Patterson, DUI, 60 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, surrender license, attend alcohol education classes (voluntary dismissal taken on companion charge of speeding).

Guilty pleas were entered as follows: Herbert Lee Williams II, DUI, 90 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs; David Jackson, DUI, 90 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, surrender license, attend alcohol education classes; Patricia Williams Smith, passing stopped school bus, \$25, costs; Parker Graham Wallman, improper equipment and failure to drive on the right half of the highway, \$15, costs; Frank Baldwin, drunk and disruptive, 30 days in jail, with credit for time already spent in jail; Chucky Dean Duncan, no operator's license, \$25, costs.

Entering guilty pleas were: Donald Elbert Banks, no operator's license, \$25, costs; Gary A. Bass, drunk and disruptive, 30 days, suspended 12 months, \$25, costs; Donna K. Carpenter, improper equipment, costs; Mary Harrington Chambers, passing stopped school bus, \$25, costs; Adrian Glen Chamberlain, simple

possession of marijuana, \$100, costs; Belinda Leigh Knight, unsafe movement, costs (charge of no operator's license was voluntarily dismissed).

Also pleading guilty were: Helen Everett Lee, DUI, 60 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, surrender license, attend alcohol education classes; Lamonte Lee, driving while license suspended, six months, suspended 12 months, \$200, costs, probation 12 months; Dannie Locklear Jr., DUI first offense (originally second offense), 90 days, suspended one year, \$100, costs, probation one year; Logan David Malloy Jr., fictitious registration plate, 30 days, suspended 12 months, \$50, costs.

Among those pleading guilty were: Bernes McMillian, DUI, 90 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, surrender license, attend alcohol education classes (voluntary dismissal taken on charge of speeding); Leonard G. Paige, drunk and disruptive, resisting a public officer, 60 days, suspended 12 months, \$50, costs, probation 12 months; James Thomas Sinclair, reckless driving (originally DUI), 60 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs; Johnnie Smith, hit and run with property damage, 30 days, suspended 12 months, \$25, costs; Tyler Zigman Terry, DUI, 90 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, surrender license, attend alcohol education classes.

Others who pleaded guilty were: Clint Andrew Allen, DUI, 90 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, surrender license, attend alcohol education classes; Harluis Ricky Bowman, trespass, 60 days, suspended three years, \$25, costs, not go on premises of Samarkand Manor, and resisting a public officer, 60 days, suspended three years, \$100, costs; Grant Harley Clayton, larceny, \$100, costs; Robert David Zbytniuk, unsafe movement, \$10, costs; Garland Simeon Dowdy, failure to stop for red light, costs.

Guilty pleas were entered as follows: David Levine, two counts of illegal sale of intoxicating liquor, eight to 12 months, suspended two years, \$300, costs, probation 24 months (a third count of illegal sale was voluntarily dismissed); Annette Hughes Lonkert, inhaling fumes from toxic substance for the purpose of intoxication, 30 days, suspended 12 months, \$50, costs; Sidney Mark Oldham, reckless driving (originally DUI), 60 days, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs; Olivia Waddell, possession of intoxicating liquor for sale, six months, suspended two years, \$250, costs, probation 24 months.

Others who pleaded guilty were: Adrian Edean Rouse, larceny, six months, suspended 12 months, \$100, costs, probation 12 months; Clarence Allen Ring, two counts of injury to personal property, six months, suspended three years, \$50, costs; Paul Lenn Brady Jr., assault, 30 days, suspended 12 months, \$25, costs, probation one year; Otis Caddell, disorderly conduct, one day in jail; James Carroll, communicating threats and simple assault, six months, suspended two years, costs and \$418 restitution, not go on premises of prosecuting witness, probation two years.

These defendants also pleaded guilty: Jennifer J. Miller, injury to personal property, six months, suspended 12 months, costs and \$201.82 restitution; Franklin Marsh, non-support, six months, suspended three years, costs and \$25 weekly payments for support of family; Willie Hall, trespass, 60 days, suspended three years, costs, not go on premises of prosecuting witness.

Pleading not guilty but convicted as charged were: Dorethea Hickman, delaying a public officer, \$25, costs; Vicky Leroy Hartsell, parking on side of roadway, costs; Dwight Richard Maness, improper equipment, costs; Talbert Stone, drunk and disruptive, 30 days, suspended 12 months, \$25, costs.

Robert Denson Prim pleaded not guilty to careless and reckless driving but was found guilty of unsafe movement. He was taxed with costs.

Pleading not guilty and found not guilty were: Clyde Patrick Campbell, communicating threats and assault on a female; and Daniel McCaskill, communicating threats.

Brenton Clay Anderson pleaded guilty to two counts of speeding, one 82 miles an hour in a 55-mile zone, the other 55 miles an hour in a 35-mile zone. He was sentenced to 30 days, suspended 12 months on payment of \$50 and costs and the condition that he surrender his license.

Klug, \$10, costs.

Because they had submitted payment for costs and fines, the court determined that these persons were pleading guilty and were waiving their right to trial: Joe Anderson Barnes, no inspection sticker; Harriet Elizabeth Faulk, Kathie Frost, and Johnny Ray Monroe, all charged with speeding; Ivone Virgil Gay, allow unlicensed person to operate motor vehicle.

In the Reciprocal Support case against Clarence Nelson, the defendant was ordered to pay \$45 twice a month to support his children.

Roosevelt Robinson was returned to court for non-compliance with a suspended judgment for non-support. He was ordered to pay \$80 that day and to pay his arrearage in full within 30 days.

Prayer for judgment was continued on payment of costs by: Marvin Edward Cox, Ronald Columbus Greene, Johnny Adam Johnson, Jimmy Lee Lewis, Steven Clarence Williams, James Ross Henesley, Richard Jewel Richardson, Kathleen M. Tyner, all charged with speed-related offenses; Carolyn Jane Hagy, possession of malt liquor by minor; and Shaun Franklin Plybon, stop sign violation.

These cases were voluntarily dismissed: Terry Michael Ashburn, injury to real property; William Thomas Beard, injury to real property; Larry Donnel Bostick, transporting non-tax paid liquor; Terry Gene Lucas, no operator's license; David Allen Stone, unsafe movement; Shawn Bennett, carrying concealed weapon; Thomas Blue Caddell, allowing person to operate motor vehicle while under the influence; Barbara K. Klug, no operator's license; Gary Francis Wilson, resisting arrest; James Carroll, injury to personal property; Kenneth Harper, assault on a female; Gary Williamson, larceny; Dean Graham, larceny.

Judgment was declared final on cash bond in the case of Preston McDougald, charged with larceny.
