

Mayor Carpenter advised Commissioner Baggett that to date the budget has not been approved. Commissioner Baggett replied, "However, what we have done is in reference to the budget." Asking where the money is to come from to pay for the extra work, Commissioner Brafford made it very clear that he was opposed to taking it from unappropriated surplus. Commissioner Allen advised his colleagues that he believes that if the extra time is given the clerk she will be able to collect unpaid taxes and get the records up to date so that these collections can be made, thus producing revenue to take care of the cost.
