Mrs. Warner was 40 years of age, the wife of Jacob Warner, a laborer, and the mother of one child.

MARYLAND BANK ROBBED

Thieves Blow Open Safe, Wrecking Building, and Secure \$3000.

Baltimore, Nov. 25.—A special to the Baltimore American from La Plata Charles county, Md., says that a number of men blew up and practically destroyed the building of the Southern Maryland Savings Bank. They secured \$3000 in cash.

The government line from the government-proving grounds from Indian Head to Washington was found to be in working order, and the police of Washington and Baltimore were promptly notified of the robbery, but no description, nor the number of participants was given in the telegram.

Up to an early hour this morning the local police department had not been able to locate the La Plata bank robbers.

An order was read to the night force at midnight when the men went on duty, and the force of detectives are on the lookout for the robbers.
