## \$100,000 to Schools.

The State Superintendent of Public Instruction to-day made the apportionment of the first \$100,000 appropriated for the public schools by the Legislature. The money will be obtainable in January.

There are 469,946 white children, 225,069 colored, and 1,947 Croatans, total 696,962. The number of children divided into \$100,000 gave the per capita apportionment as .14348. The number of children in each county was multiplied by this decimal and that amount given the county respectively.-Raleigh Times, 13th.
