Driving at a fast clip, according to witnesses, the motorcycle officers were behind her almost before anyone was aware. The grinding brakes and a yell by James Haley, her secret service man, gave Mrs. Coolidge her only warning and as she jumped to one side of the riad the leading machine shot between her and Haley. The motorcycle detachment, which was coming to White Court to escort the President to Cambridge, proceeded to the summer White House without stopping .- Associated Press.
