Burwash, Sussex, England, Dec. 4.—Satisfactory improvement in the condition of Rudyard Kipling, who is suffering from double pneumonia at his retreat here, continued throughout the day. The author is not suffering pain, and is completely conscious. His strong constitution is believed to be withstanding the disease as well as can be expected.

Messages from all parts of the world have reached this little village since the illness of Kipling became known. King George has requested that he be kept in con-

stant touch with the condition of the patient. Stanley Baldwin, the British prime minister, who is a cousin of Kipling, has made a similar request. —Associated Press.
