Young announces that the road from Route 22 near Holt Lake t the Sampson-Johnston county line in the direction of Newton Grove. has been added to the State High way system. The road covers distance of 15.6 miles. The road has not, however, been taken over by the State for maintenance, be cause of the fact that at the pres ent time there is no suitable road in this vicinity to be maintained Capt S. C.
