That negotiable coupon bonds of Johnston County, North Carolina, be issued in the maximum principal amount of \$750,000.00 for the purpose of paying the cost of the erection and purchase of schoolhouses necessary to maintain a six months school term and to be known as "Johnston County School Building Bonds."

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That statement of the county debt for school purposes has been filed with the clerk pursuant to the County Finance Act and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. 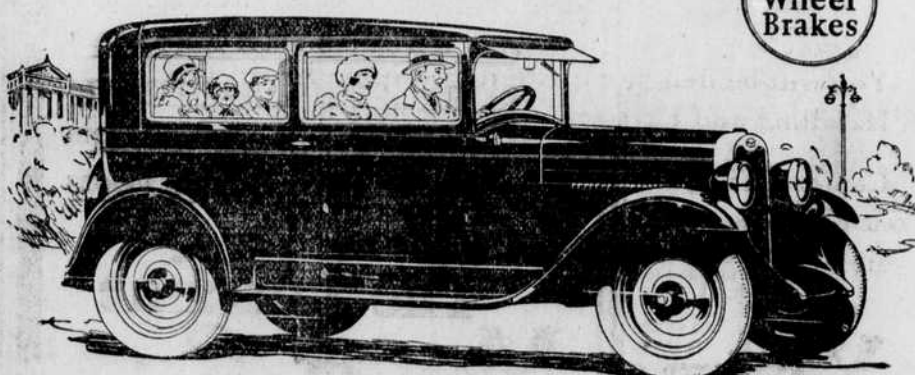
