

Speaking of the object of education Edward Ingle well says in the Manufacturers' Record that it is "the equipment of the products of the schools (the children) to perform their full duty to their God, their country and themselves."

Industrial education does not mean "learning a trade" any more than studying arithmetic means learning a trade, says C. E Vawter. All true industrial schools should include a course in the ciences, both theoretical and practical, that fits one for any industry. The object of industrial training is to teach the art of doing. It trains the eye. It trains the hand. One takes a course in wood turning, not because he ever expects to be a cabinet maker or a carpenter any more than those expect to become practical chemists who take a course in chemistry.

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
