August Weather for 15 Years.

The following data, covering the month of August for a period of fifteen years, has been compiled from the weather bureau records at Raleigh, N. C.

Temperature—Mean or normal temperature, 77 degrees. Warmest month was that of 1900, with an average of 82 degrees; coldest month was that of 1899, with an average of 73 degrees.

Precipitation (Rain and Melted Snow). Average for the month, 6.17 inches. Average number of days with .01 of an inch or more, 12. Greatest monthly precipitation was 11.21 inches in 1901; least monthly precipitation was 1.94 inches in 1897.

Clouds and Weather—Average number of clear days, 10; partly cloudy days, 8; cloudy days, 3.

Wind—Prevailing winds have been from the southwest; highest velocity of the wind was 38 miles from the northwest, on August 20, 1900.
