The temple committee of the Masons, having in charge the erection of the Masonic Temple in Raleigh, met last evening in the office of Grand Secretary Drewry.

Already the committee has possession of the former Mason store on West Hargett street. Last night the arrangements were laid propositions submitted and accepted which will place in its hands the property of the Raleigh Savings Bank on the corner, the site for the temple.

Under the agreement the present occupants have six months in which to give possession, but it is hoped that by early spring they will have secured other places for temporary abode so that work may begin. If they do work will begin then. If not, then at the end of six months it will begin.

The committee spends in securing the site \$50,000. It has \$50,000 available and desires to add \$20,000 to it so that every detail of the magnificent building planned may be perfected, and it is greatly encouraged at the bright prospect. It is stated that the money in the committee's hands has increased by judicious investment, and that now every dollar subscribed has increased to more than a dollar.

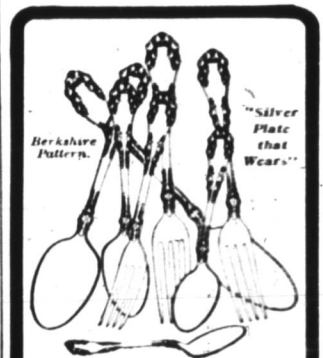
