Samuel Gill was the real invent or of the Colt revolver, which wa used in the United States army for a long time and has for many years held a high rank among scientific and practical fire arms. This was the best product of his inventive

> It is said that after Gill had completed the model of the revolver he went to Washington with the intention of having it patented.

While there he became acquainted with Colt, to whom he showed the model. Colt seeing that the invention was good obtained posses ion of it by borrowing it, saying what to do, and when it should be that he wanted to show it to a friend. 
