**The School: Our Pride**

This week we have compiled from the three Honor Rolls furnished for publication during the Fall Term of the Graded School, a list of those pupils whose names appeared on each roll for the term. It is to be deplored that only fifteen received this distinction out of the large number who are enrolled.

We feel that many unavoidable conditions have operated against the attendance. During the term various diseases to which children are heirs, have kept many at home thus reducing the average of those pupils. For to secure a place on the honor roll one must not have been absent more than three days in the month, must make an average of 95 on studies and not be tardy a single time. But while it is true that some were kept away, there are a number who are slothful and failing to reach school on time, are allowed by their parents to trot about the streets all day and a good part of the night. Such pupils should be made to pay a penalty for their neglect and the parents need to have a more careful watch over their boys and girls.

The school should be dear to us, —should stand as a monument to our love for and our interest in the young of the community. It is usually the boy who shirks school duties that gets into mischief about the towns and cities of our land, and the girls who pose on the street corners daily will not grow to that height to which all true womanhood should tend.

The school is ours—our best expression of a desire for a better and higher citizenship. To neglect it is to dwarf that development in boys and girls capable of making a great Commonwealth greater.

Mr. J. O. W. Gravelly, of Rocky Mount, was in town Wednesday. Mr. Gravelly is regarded as one of the best informed tobacco men in Eastern Carolina, and has always stood with the farmers in the effort to bring about those conditions which are for the farmer's good.

While in town we interviewed Mr. Gravelly on the prospect for prices for the coming crop, and he strongly expressed the opinion that prices would be reasonably good under any circumstances. This is assured by the fact that the crop will go on the market that is short owing to several small crops for the past year or two. We advise the planting of tobacco to a reasonable extent as all signs point to good prices for the season's crop. Martin County has the proper soil for bright leaf and our people know the safe method of cultivation and curing.
