We feel that many unavoidable conditions have operated against the attendance. During the term various diseases to which children are helrs, have kept many at home thus rebucing the average of those papils. For to secure a place on the honor roll one must not have been absent more than three day in the month, must make an aver age of 95 on studies and not be tardy a single time. But while is Is true that some were kept away. there are a number who are sloth ful and failing to reach school on time, are allowed by their parents to trot about the streets all day and a good part of the night. Such pupils should be made to pay to penalty for their neglect and the parents need to have a more care ful watch over their boys and girld.
