Astoria Mills Burned

Sunday about twelve o'clock, the Astoria Mills at Jamesville were consumed by fire which broke out in the boiler room. The watchman was eating dinner when the fire was discovered. An alarm was given but the fire apparatus being injured at the beginning, there was nothing to check the flames. Only the dry kilns were uninjured. The mills belonged to the Dennis Simmons Lumber Company, whose chief office is located in Williamston, and were valued at about \$50,000, working two hundred hands. The loss was partially covered by insurance. Capt. T. W. Tilghman, President of the Company, after conferring with the other members, gave out the information that the mills would be rebuilt. The loss is great to the people of Jamesville as well, as it throws so many out of employment for months.
