Public Sale of Timber Lands

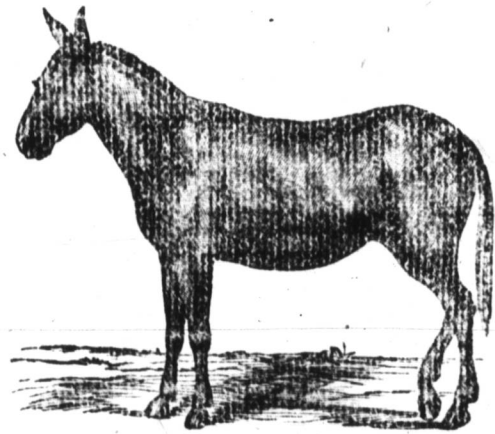
