**Bond Sale**

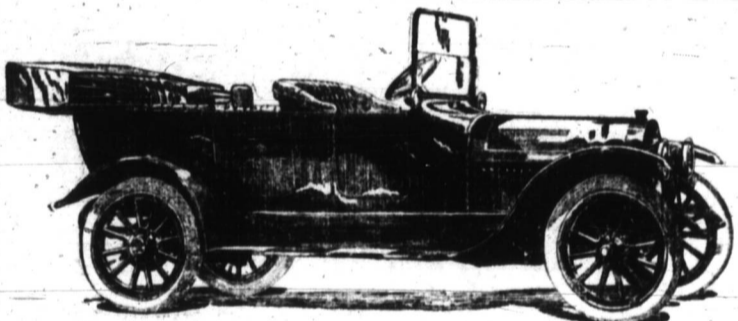

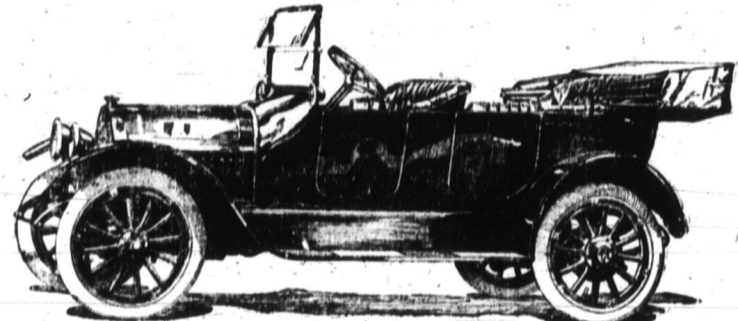
