### Ginners' Report

The Department of Commerce reports that Martin County has ginned to November 14th., 3,624 bales of cotton as against 6,592 for the same period last year. This is a falling off of 2,968 bales. The crop, however, is about three weeks late, yet the number of bales in the final count will be largely reduced. The number of bales in the State shows a total of 112,277 less than last year for the date above.
