Evangelistic Services



The opening of the Memorial Baptist Church marked the beginning of evangelistic services by Dr. Blackwell, of Norfolk, who is well known in North Carolina. He has made a profound impression on the people here by the plain, practical application of the Scriptures to human needs. Though seventy-two years old, his power has not lessened, but rather increased, and every man must be struck with his earnestness in his effort to upbuild God's Kingdom. By simple illustration he makes plain the truths of the Bible. These services are held nightly, beginning at 7:45 with a song service. Everybody is cordially invited to attend and join in the effort for good to the community.

**A Test in Prices.**

There are a great many people, farmers especially, who think that foreign markets are better than those at home. The bigger markets have a corps of gas bags parading all over the county turning off stereotyped "speels" to fool the tobacco farmers. Sad to relate, many are caught in the net, and nine out of ten have a season of regretting to follow. These spenders will go into a neighborhood and pick out the man with the very best crop and persuade him to go on their market. Of course, good weed sells high every where, but some other farmer is fooled into thinking that he should carry his crop too. So often he gets from \$2.00 to \$5 less than he could right here in Williamston.

A case in point was seen here Tuesday. A tobacco buyer from Rocky Mount induced Mr. Fred Roebuck to send several grades to his house. Before leaving the market, Mr. Roebuck procured a sample from each pile with the card on which was the price. Tuesday he brought five wagons full here and unloaded on the Dixie floor. The grades were similar to that sold at Rocky Mount, but the prices received ranged \$2 to \$5 higher. This is only one among the many instances recorded here on both the Roanoke and Dixie floors, where the weed gets the topmost figures.

One case is that of a man going among the farmers of the county exhibiting a sample of tobacco, and claiming that same sold for only 15c on the Williamston market. Upon investigation it was learned that he had never been on the market with a load.
