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BERTIE AND MARTIN APPOINT HIGHWAY COMMITTEE

Enthusiastic Meeting Held in Windsor Monday. Many From Martin in Attendance

A meeting was held in Windsor on Monday morning June 24th by Bertie people for the purpose of securing for this section a branch of the Trans Continental Highway. About forty Martin County people were present and appointed a committee to act with similar committees from other counties interested in selecting a route and other business as may be brought before it. Bertie also appointed a like committee. Halifax and Beaufort Counties had representatives there, but no marked action was taken by them.

Col. Benahan Cameron, of the Bankhead Highway Commission was the principal speaker of the occasion and placed before the people the plans for the highway and spoke interestingly in favor of the same from an economical standpoint.

Hon. H. S. Ward, of Washington, in his characteristic manner spoke on the need of National Highways and the obligation of the Government in building them.

Highway Spur, Norfolk To N. C.

A meeting of paramount importance to the business of Norfolk has been called for July 2nd, here in Norfolk, to consider plans for the creation of a spur to the Bankhead National Highway, leading from North Carolina into Norfolk.

Several speakers have been invited, and the meeting will be broadly advertised.

Concerning the importance of this proposition. President Lesner, of the Tidewater Automobile Association, has received a letter from T. Gray Coburn, a prominent automobile manufacturer, outlining the reasons why the Norfolk people should at this time pay especial attention to this problem of good roads with the view of competing with other cities.

The meeting called for the second will be devoted largely to the consideration of the building of a bridge across the Roanoke river at Williamston, on the route leading from North Carolina into this city.

Amongst those invited to speak are Colonel Benahan Cameron, a North Carolina road commissioner, and F. D. Winston and H. W. Stubbs.
